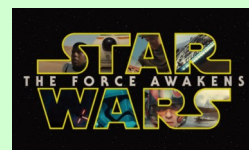
8/4, **Mary Poppins**

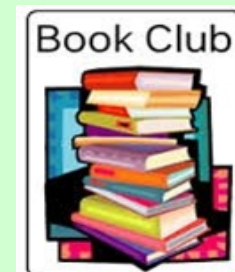

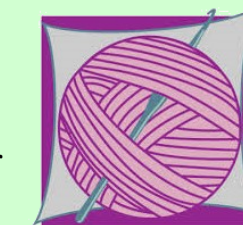
